Glory to Jesus Christ!

This Sunday, January 22nd, is the tragic anniversary of the Supreme Court decision “Roe vs. Wade” that first allowed abortion on demand in our country. Since that date there have been over 64,400,000 legal abortions in our country. That’s over 10X more children killed than Jewish people killed in the Holocaust. As we are all well aware, the landmark case was overturned this past June with Dobbs vs. Jackson. This took away the federal “right” to abortion on demand. However, I personally do not consider the “Dobbs” decision to be much of a victory. There are few people who had a change of heart on this issue because of the Court decision. In fact, some people are more committed to abortion than before.

Our recently deceased Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI, once said “Only if people change will the world change; and in order to change, people need the light that comes from God, the light which so unexpectedly came Christmas night, entered into our night.”

For the world to change, for our country and our communities to change we need a change of heart, not just a change in law. We need to show others that we care about the dignity of human life from conception to natural death, not just in our words, not just in our voting, but in our daily lives and actions. Tertullian, the Christian writer of the 2-3<sup>rd</sup> century imagined the world saying about Christians: “Look how they love one another (for they themselves [pagans] hate one another); and how they are ready to die for each other (for they themselves are readier to kill each other).”

Do others look at us and know what we are opposed to? Or do they know what we love? “Choose Life that you and your children may live!” (Deuteronomy 30:19)

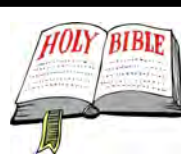
