Glory to Jesus Christ!

Last week I was speaking with a religious sister (a friend) about the Gospel for the first Sunday of Lent. She said, “You know, Jesus went into the desert on a contemplative retreat.” A retreat is a time away, a time to reflect and take stock of our lives. It is a time to strip everything away and to encounter God. This week’s reading of the Transfiguration is even more explicitly a “retreat” theme. Jesus takes Peter and the sons of Zebedee up a mountain, away from everything, and is changed before them. They are alone with the Law and the Prophets to see who Jesus really is.

Last Sunday and Monday were kind of like a retreat. How did you spend your snow day? When it snows like that many things shut down. Here at the rectory the electricity and internet were going in and out. Now, personally, I did spend more time cleaning my desk than in deep contemplative prayer, but it was still a break from the ordinary. I was outside doing a tiny bit of shoveling and even spent a few minutes just watching the wind whip the snow around.

This is what Lent is. A time to fast and abstain from the ordinary. A time to clean and take stock, to get rid of things that have accumulated. A time to see ourselves as we really are and invite God in. Though I pray that this is the last snow storm of the season, I hope that we continue to take time out to be with our saving God!

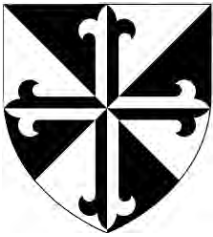

## Altar Flowers



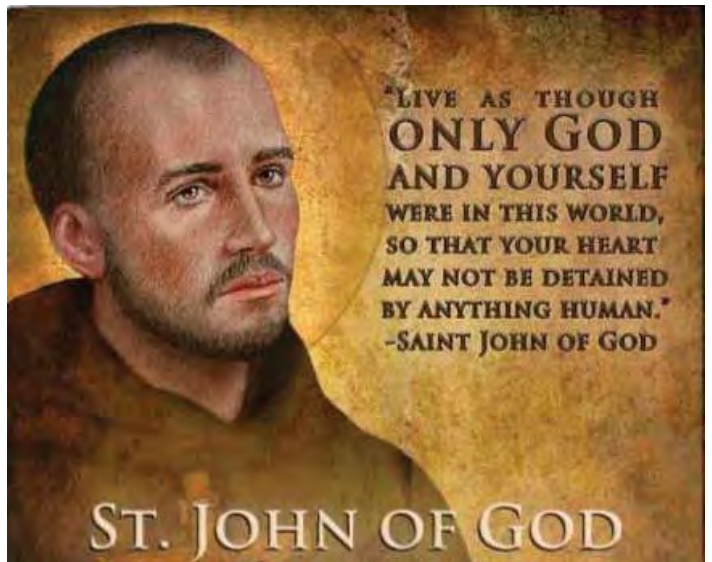

## One Vision, One Community

When I first became a parishioner at St. Raymond in 1989, there were 6 Masses on the weekend at our church. There were 2 on Saturday evening (4, 5:30), 3 on Sunday morning (7:30, 9, and 11), and a 6pm Mass on Sunday evening. It would be great to think that we will return to that someday, but the lack of church attendance is not just a local trend – it is nationwide. We also know that the closing of our school played a significant role in this loss of participation. We now have one Mass on Sunday at 8am which, in the winter months, normally fills half the church. And that is why we are fortunate to have St. Raymond Church designated as the location of the Cape May County Regional Hispanic Ministry.

The arrival of this ministry has breathed new life into our church. The interior of the church was scrubbed from top to bottom. The rugs and pews have never looked as good as they do now, and that took a lot of work. But that was only the beginning, as the landscaping on the outside has also given the exterior a fresh look. These are things that our folks simply have been unable to do for years. And now the Hispanic Ministry has taken on the task of raising funds and renovating the Chapel, which was in desperate need of repair.

And we also need to say that the displays for Our Lady of Guadalupe and Christmas that our fellow parishioners erect in St. Raymond are, by far, the best ever in our Church and, we proudly believe, the best in the Diocese. The number of folks sending pictures of the creche on their phones to their family members would back this up. And the fervor with which the Hispanic community (and many of our English-speaking community) display by coming to church on December 12th at 5am to honor Our Lady of Guadalupe is humbling.

We are one Parish Community. Some of us speak English, some of us do not. But we walk together in our Faith, and together make one vibrant community that serves the Lord. Individually, the clock would be ticking on our beloved St. Raymond, but collectively the future is bright. We are fortunate to have the Hispanic folks as part of our church and look forward to growing that One Parish Community.

## Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica

### Los Siete Sacramentos de la Iglesia

*Bautismo, Confirmación, Eucarística, Penitencia, Unción de los enfermos, Orden Sacerdotal y Matrimonio*

#### Capítulo Primero

#### Los Sacramentos de la Iniciación Cristiana

#### Artículo 1 EL SACRAMENTO DEL BAUTISMO

#### VII LA GRACIA DEL BAUTISMO

**1265** El Bautismo no solamente purifica de todos los pecados, hace también del neófito "una nueva creatura" (2 Co 5,17), un hijo adoptivo de Dios (cf Ga 4,5-7) que ha sido hecho "partícipe de la naturaleza divina" (2 P 1,4), miembro de Cristo (cf 1 Co 6,15; 12,27), coheredero con Él (Rm 8,17) y templo del Espíritu Santo (cf 1 Co 6,19).

**1266** La Santísima Trinidad da al bautizado la gracia santificante, la gracia de la justificación que :

- le hace capaz de creer en Dios, de esperar en Él y de amarlo mediante las virtudes teologales;
- le concede poder vivir y obrar bajo la moción del Espíritu Santo mediante los dones del Espíritu Santo;
- le permite crecer en el bien mediante las virtudes morales.

Así todo el organismo de la vida sobrenatural del cristiano tiene su raíz en el santo Bautismo.

#### Incorporados a la Iglesia, Cuerpo de Cristo

**1267** El Bautismo hace de nosotros miembros del Cuerpo de Cristo. "Por tanto [...] somos miembros los unos de los otros" (Ef 4,25). El Bautismo incorpora a la Iglesia. De las fuentes bautismales nace el único pueblo de Dios de la Nueva Alianza que trasciende todos los límites naturales o humanos de las naciones, las culturas, las razas y los sexos: "Porque en un solo Espíritu hemos sido todos bautizados, para no formar más que un cuerpo" (1 Co 12,13).

**1268** Los bautizados vienen a ser "piedras vivas" para "edificación de un edificio espiritual, para un sacerdocio santo" (1 P 2,5). Por el Bautismo participan del sacerdocio de Cristo, de su misión profética y real, son "linaje elegido, sacerdocio real, nación santa, pueblo adquirido, para anunciar las alabanzas de aquel que os ha llamado de las tinieblas a su admirable luz" (1 P 2,9). El Bautismo hace participar en el sacerdocio común de los fieles.

**1269** Hecho miembro de la Iglesia, el bautizado ya no se pertenece a sí mismo (1 Co 6,19), sino al que murió y resucitó por nosotros (cf 2 Co 5,15). Por tanto, está llamado a someterse a los demás (Ef 5,21; 1 Co 16,15-16), a servirles (cf Jn 13,12-15) en la comunión de la Iglesia, y a ser "obediente y dócil" a los pastores de la Iglesia (Hb 13,17) y a considerarlos con respeto y afecto (cf 1 Ts 5,12-13). Del mismo modo que el Bautismo es la fuente de responsabilidades y deberes, el bautizado goza también de derechos en el seno de la Iglesia: recibir los sacramentos, ser alimentado con la palabra de Dios y ser sostenido por los otros auxilios espirituales de la Iglesia (cf LG 37; CIC can. 208-223; CCEO, can. 675,2).

**1270** Los bautizados "renacidos [por el bautismo] como hijos de Dios están obligados a confesar delante de los hombres la fe que recibieron de Dios por medio de la Iglesia" (LG 11) y de participar en la actividad apostólica y misionera del Pueblo de Dios (cf LG 17; AG 7,23).
