Glory to Jesus Christ!

February 24, 2022 was a terrible day in world history. Vladimir Putin ordered a special operation to "take back" a section of sovereign Ukraine for Russia. The week before, February 10-17, I had been in Western Ukraine for the priestly ordination of a dear friend and the 40th birthday of a religious sister. Though the political situation was tense then, I didn't image what was to come.

Next week will be the one year anniversary of this Russian invasion. I do not say "war" because the war started 9 years ago when Russia invaded Eastern Ukraine and illegally annexed the Crimean Peninsula.

Between 2014 and 2022 over 14,000 Ukrainians were killed in this war. Thousands more have perished since.

On Sunday February 26 I will give a presentation on the religious history of Ukraine. I will discuss the advent of Christianity around the year 988, the rise of the Orthodox Faith, reconciliation, and the origins of the Ukrainian Catholic Church. I will also explain how faith has played a major role in the current conflict.

The presentation will begin at 3pm in St. John of God Church and will last approximately 1 hour 15 minutes including questions. God Bless you and Pray for Ukraine!

Something to Think About

What is Ash Wednesday?

What does it mean to Us?

Ash Wednesday is a solemn reminder of human mortality and the need for reconciliation with God and marks the beginning of the penitential Lenten season. It is commonly observed with ashes and fasting.

Ash Wednesday is one of the most popular and important holy days in the liturgical calendar. Ash Wednesday opens Lent, a season of fasting and prayer. It takes place 46 days before Easter Sunday, and is chiefly observed by Catholics, although many other Christians observe it, too.

Ash Wednesday comes from the ancient Jewish tradition of penance and fasting. The practice includes the wearing of ashes on the head. The ashes symbolize the dust from which God made us. As the priest applies the ashes to a person's forehead, he speaks the words: "Repent and believe in the Gospel." Alternatively, the priest may speak the more traditional words, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Ashes also symbolize grief, in this case, grief that we have sinned and caused division from God. The ashes are made from blessed palm branches, taken from the previous year's Palm Sunday Mass.

It is important to remember that Ash Wednesday is a day of penitential prayer and fasting. All Catholics from 18 to 59 years of age are obligated to fast unless a medical condition requires them to eat. All Catholics from 14 years of age and older are obligated to abstain unless medical conditions prohibit them from doing so. Many Catholics choose not to dine out or go shopping and some remain home. Feasting is highly inappropriate. It is not required that a person wear the ashes for the rest of the day, and they may be washed off after Mass. However, many people keep the ashes as a reminder until the evening.


"Soup's On" Ministry
